THOUGHTS FROM PASTOR FRANCIE...



"The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and selfcontrol. There is no law against such things." (Galatians 5:22-23)

There are those who say that if we wanted to summarize all the teachings of Jesus in one word, that word would be "love." When the apostle Paul listed the fruits of the Spirit, the first one he listed was love. When writing to the church in Corinth, Paul elaborated on the value of love by describing it with these words:

"Love is patient; love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice in wrongdoing, but rejoices in the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never ends. ... And now faith, hope, and love abide, these three; and the greatest of these is love." (1 Corinthians. 13:4-8,13)

When I was a child, one of the first Bible verses we memorized in Sunday School (probably because it was a short verse and easier to remember!) was 1 John 4:19:

"We love because he first loved us." We are able to love others and God because God loved us first, and God built within each of us the ability to love. When we love others, we are also learning more about the character of God. As the first of the fruits of the Spirit, love is a fruit that flows out of us from the Spirit of God that is within us.

So... as individuals and as a congregation we will seek ways to love our neighbors and to love each other: loving them by forgiving, encouraging, listening, and providing help in difficult times. Every time we show love, we strengthen our connection with God.

Our General Fund Income and Expense through December 31st is as follows:

As of December 31st, we have \$135,657.48 in the bank, of which \$119,274.94 is available in the General Fund.

Please keep in mind that the flood repair work is not yet complete, and that we still owe the contractor \$20,486 upon completion of this work. In December, we received a \$2000 reimbursement payment from the City of Akron for over budget items in our Backpack Program. We also received a \$1000 donation from Little Discover's Day Care.

EXPANSION OF BUILDING USE

During the last few months, we have experienced some changes in our building.

The repairs to deal with the flooding in the Nursery and the Little Discoverers Daycare Office are nearing completion. Our insurance coverage paid for all these repairs except for the \$1,000 deductible.

Little Discoverers approached us about renting another room to support their growing program, so the Session has approved renting them the Nursery to use as their office, and the room they formerly used as their office will become an additional classroom. If we ever have a need for a room for children during worship on Sunday mornings, we will use the classrooms.

Prevail Church has requested use of the upstairs room that was the old Preschool office, and Session has approved their use of this room. Prevail Church will periodically have the carpet scrubbed in the Fellowship Hall, and they will do additional cleaning of the Fellowship Hall and upstairs restrooms.

We are blessed to have Little Discoverers, Prevail Church, and Eastminster Presbytery share our building with us. We are grateful for the service they provide, as well as the financial benefit they provide to our congregation as we seek to maintain our church building in an effective manner.
