In 2016 Firestone Park Presbyterian Church along with other congregations in the Eastminster Presbytery began supporting the efforts of the National Evangelical Synod of Syria and Lebanon to help educate and feed Syrian refugee children. FPPC has walked faithfully in this effort each summer by raising funds to continue to support NESSL in its outreach to this community.

Earlier this year we were privileged to have our missionaries, the Reverends Elmarie and Scott Parker lead us in worship via Zoom. They also updated us on conditions in the region. They have recently returned to Beirut and have found conditions to be have deteriorated while they were away for a few months ago. Inflation has gotten worse. Scott reports that a single apple now costs a dollar. Lebanese families are struggling

- Increase our involvement and become more relevant to the community
- PLANS:
 - Research/seek grants for hiring a community liaison
 - Work with other churches/schools/organizations in the area (Presbyterian and others)
 - Work with city officials
 - Consider "rebranding" our church (new name?)

Mission:

- Continue mission involvement while reassessing and looking for new opportunities
- PLANS:
 - Expand the Blessing Box to include a "Communications Center" (devotionals, posters, announcements, small community chalkboard)
 - Research/seek grants to fund current and new mission projects

Worship:

- Worship jointly with Allenside and with others beyond our congregation
- PLANS:
 - Work with other churches to have joint worship services (Ash Wednesday, Akron-wide services, etc)
 - Offer our church services to other congregations if their pastor is away
 - o Continue our annual Tadmor outdoor services
 - o Reach out to Firestone Park schools to add to our worship services (music, drama, etc)

Christian Education:

- Reassess and revitalize our Christian Education program
- PLANS:
 - Ask others outside our congregation to facilitate Bible studies at our building or online
 - o Join in Bible studies offered by other churches (in person and online)
 - Evaluate participating in a program such as "Adult Bible Fellowship" (ABF)
 - Reinstitute Pastor's Studies

Fellowship:

- Reassess and revitalize our fellowship opportunities
- PLANS:
 - Redesign the back of the sanctuary to enhance fellowship and create a more inviting space
 - o Poll the congregation about the best ways to provide fellowship opportunities

Congregational Care:

- Adapt our methods of congregational care to conform to the changing needs of our congregants
- PLANS:
 - o Continue the periodic "care packages" process
 - Assess and help with technology to make worship and congregational activities more inclusive
